To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty Five Thousand Eight Hundred and Four Dollars (\$25,804.00) to contract the services of Avitar Associates of New England, Inc. for the year 2013. This sum represents payment for the third year of a five-year level funded contract that provides for a full update of property values to market rate in 2015 as required by RSA 75:8-a, as well as general assessing services throughout each of the five years and field data verification of information appearing on property tax cards. MINUTES OF THE EFFINGHAM TOWN MEETING 2012

Session I: Tuesday, March 13, 2012

- J. Michael Cauble, Moderator called the meeting to order at 11:00 AM at the Effingham Elementary School. A motion was made by Marilynn Maughan, seconded by Sheila Jones to forego the reading of the first two articles. Motion passed by unanimous voice vote. Mr. Cauble declared the polls open.
- J. Michael Cauble, Moderator closed the polls at 7:00 PM; Ballot Clerks Tracy Cragin, Cheryl Madden and Christopher Wesinger, with Selectman Susan Slack and Selectmen Theresa Swanick counted the town ballots for election of officers. The one question ballot was counted by Marilynn Maughan and J. Michael Cauble. The Governor Wentworth Regional School District ballots were delivered to Wolfeboro by Police Chief Joseph Collins for counting. Meeting was adjourned at 8:30 PM to re-convene at the Effingham Elementary School on Saturday, March 17, 2012 at 9:00 AM.

This is a housekeeping issue. The Planning Board is in favor of this article Yes 220 No 39

Session II: J. Michael Cauble, Moderator gaveled the meeting to order 9:00 AM on Saturday, March17, 2012 with approximately 60 Effingham residents present. Town Clerk Marilynn Maughan, read the election results from March 13, 2012. The pledge of allegiance was said by those present. A moment of silence was held to remember those Effingham residents that passed away in 2011. Moderator Cauble then proceeded to explain how the meeting would be conducted and read Article 3 to the voters present.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty Five Thousand Eight Hundred and Four Dollars (\$25,804.00) to contract the services of Avitar Associates of New England, Inc. for the year 2012. This sum represents payment for the second year of a five-year level funded contract that provides for a full update of property values to market rate in 2015 as required by RSA 75:8-a, as well as general assessing services throughout each of the five years and field data verification of information appearing on property tax cards. This requires a majority vote. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. The article was moved by John Meisner, seconded by Gwen English

Selectman Theresa Swanick explained the aspects of the article. No questions were posed.

The article passed on a unanimous voice vote.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$120,000.00) for road reconstruction. This requires a majority vote. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. The article was moved by John Meisner, seconded by Gwen English.

Jory Augenti questioned why this article was not designated as a Special Warrant Article. Selectman Slack explained the difference between a Special Warrant Article and a regular article.

The article passed on an unanimous voice vote.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred Thirty Six Thousand Dollars (\$136,000.00) for road resurfacing and sealing. This requires a majority vote.

The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. <u>The article was moved by John Meisner, seconded by Timothy Eldridge.</u> Following the discussion of the article, the article passed by unanimous voice vote.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to sell the Effingham Fire Department's 2005 Chevrolet Ambulance by sealed bid to the highest responsible bidder, and to delegate to the Board of Selectmen the authority to establish a minimum bid price, if any, and to otherwise determine the terms of sale. This requires a majority vote. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. The article was moved by John Meisner, seconded by Gwenda English. Irene Riordan made a motion to amend the article to read "...and to otherwise determine the terms of sale. Proceeds from the sale shall be returned to the taxpayers of Effingham." The motion to amend the article was seconded by Patricia Riker. Discussion followed on the article including the amendment. Following the discussion, the amendment was voted on by a standing vote count. The vote count was 19 yes, 30 no. The amendment failed. A petition was received by the Moderator prior to the reading of the article requesting a ballot vote. Following the discussion of the article, the ballot vote was taken. The article passed on a ballot vote of 54 yes, 6 no.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Four Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$4,400.00) to purchase the Clerk/Motor Vehicle MAAP software system from Avitar Associates of New England, Inc., for use by the Town Clerk. The purchase price includes the installation, training and one year licensing agreement. This is a special warrant article. This requires a majority vote. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. The article was moved by Marilynn Maughan, seconded by Gwenda English. Marilynn explained the purpose of purchasing this software to update the MAAP system for motor vehicles and to obtain an on-line system for renewals. The article passed by unanimous voice vote.

Following the passing of this article, a motion was made by Gwenda English, seconded by Irene Riordan to restrict reconsideration of Articles 3 through 7. The motion passed by unanimous voice vote.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty-Nine Thousand Three Hundred Fifty Three Dollars (\$29,353.00) for payments to the following Capital Reserve Accounts previously established:

This is a special warrant article. This requires a majority vote. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. The article was moved by Susan Slack, seconded by Henry Spencer. There was no discussion. The article passed by majority voice vote.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the Huntress Bridge Maintenance Capital Reserve Fund. The current balance of Thirty Four Thousand Three Hundred Seventy Three Dollars and Seventy Five Cents (\$34,373.75) as of December 31, 2011, plus any accumulated interest to date of withdrawal, are to be transferred to the Town's general fund. In the event this article fails, article 14 will be passed over. This is a special warrant article. This requires a majority vote. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. The article was moved by John Meisner, seconded by Henry Spencer. Following discussion of this article, the article was passed by majority voice vote.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Thirty Four Thousand Three Hundred Seventy Three Dollars (\$34,373.00) to be added to the Town Owned Bridges Expendable Trust Fund previously established, with said funds to come from the Town's unreserved fund balance. This sum represents the funds from the discontinued Huntress Bridge Maintenance Capital Reserve Fund. This article will be null and void in the event article 13 fails. This is a special warrant article. This requires a majority voice vote. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. The article was moved by John Meisner, seconded by Irene Riordan. No discussion of the article. The article passed by majority voice vote.

A motion was made by Gwenda English, seconded by John Meisner to restrict reconsideration of Articles 8 through 14. The motion passed by unanimous voice vote.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to establish the position of elected Town Auditor, as provided by RSA 41:31-b, to perform an annual audit of Town financial records and report findings to the State of New Hampshire Department of Revenue Administration and the

Effingham Board of Selectmen, and to set the compensation for the Town Auditor at \$500.00 per year. This requires a majority vote. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee. The article was moved by John Meisner, seconded by Susan Slack. Susan Slack explained the purpose of having an elected Auditor based upon the requirements of the Department of Revenue. Following the discussion of the article, the article passed by unanimous voice vote.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to establish the Municipal Auditing Expendable Trust Fund for the purpose of funding professional services related to auditing financial records of the Town. Also, to raise and appropriate to this fund the sum of Seven Thousand Dollars (\$7,000.00) and further, to name the Board of Selectmen as agents to expend from this fund. This is a special warrant article. This requires a majority vote. The Selectmen and Budget Committee recommend this appropriation. The article was moved by John Meisner, seconded by Henry Spencer. Susan Slack explained that at some point in time the Town will need to have a "professional audit" done by a certified public accounting firm based upon the requirements of the Department of Revenue and federal accounting standards. Following discussion of the article, the article passed by unanimous voice vote.

Article 17. To see if the Town of Effingham will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) in support of Carroll County Transit's Senior and General Public Transportation. This article is petitioned by Louise E. Champion and others. This requires a majority vote. The Selectmen and Budget Committee do not recommend this appropriation. The article was moved by Cheryle Feirick, seconded by Henry Spencer. Following the discussion of this article, a standing vote count was taken. The result was 27 yes and 19 no. The article passed by a majority standing vote count.

A motion was made by Gwenda English, seconded by John Meisner to restrict reconsideration of Articles 15 through 17. The motion passed by unanimous voice vote.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,235,406 for the ensuing year for general operations. This requires a majority vote. The Selectmen and the Budget Committee recommend this appropriation.

The article was moved by Theresa Swanick, seconded by Gwenda English. Before the article was moved and seconded, a petition was submitted to have the Selectmen's Salary line voted on by ballot vote. A motion was made by Henry Spencer, seconded by Jory Augenti to reduce the Selectmen's salary line from \$21,000.00 to \$12,000.00. A discussion followed regarding the amendment to the salary line. Following the discussion, a ballot vote was taken on the motion to amend the Selectmen's salary line from \$21,000.00 to \$12,000.00. The ballot vote was Yes 14 No 31. The motion to amend the Selectmen's Salary line was defeated. Following the reading of the article by Moderator Cauble, Article 18 was passed by unanimous voice vote. The sum of \$1,235,406.00 was approved for 2012 as the sum for general operations.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to delegate the duties and responsibilities of the cemetery trustees to the Board of Selectmen as provided in RSA 289:6, II-a. The article was moved by Theresa Swanick, seconded by Paul Potter. A discussion ensued regarding why the Selectmen were proposing this change in the responsibilities of the cemeteries. Avril Davis made a motion to Table the Article indefinitely. The motion was seconded by Irene Riordan. Moderator Cauble explained that in order for a motion to table an article to pass, it must pass by a 2/3 majority vote. The vote was taken by a standing vote count. Article 23: To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting. Selectman Theresa Swanick announced the town website was up and running. Michael Gruel asked for the Selectmen to investigate the possibility of a Director of Cemeteries. Jory Augenti asked for the tax status of Camp Marist. A motion was made by Eric Potter, seconded by Marilynn Maughan to adjourn the meeting. The meeting was adjourned at 1:00 PM.

Selectmen's Report

The March 2012 election brought another new member to the Board of Selectmen. Henry Spencer joined Theresa Swanick (2014) and Susan Slack (2013).

It was with regret that the Selectmen accepted the resignation of our Police Chief Joe Collins, who went on to accept the chief's position in Gilmanton. The Selectmen were pleased to promote Timothy Butts into the chief's position. He had served the town well for five years in the sergeant's position, so the transition went smoothly. Our new sergeant is Anthony Sacco, a former member of the Ossipee Police Department.

The 2012 Town Meeting approved a warrant article allowing the Selectmen to sell the town's ambulance. After a first round of bid solicitation brought an unreasonably low offer, the Selectmen sought bids a second time, this time establishing sale conditions that permitted other municipalities to bid. The ambulance was sold to Leicester, MA for \$26,550, which the Selectmen are asking voters this year to appropriate to the Fire Truck and Equipment Capital Reserve Fund.

The second phase of reconstructing Town House Road was completed. Another mile of road bed was rebuilt and a base coat of asphalt was applied. We are asking voters to approve funds for the third phase of reconstruction and base coat this summer. In 2014, the plan is for the entire 3-mile stretch to receive a final top coat of asphalt.

The Selectmen authorized improvements to the offices in the modular unit behind the Municipal Office Building used by various town boards, the Zoning Enforcement Officer and the Welfare Officer. New carpeting was installed, and painting and furnishings have made the space more suitable for town business. New carpeting and painting were also authorized for the meeting and computer rooms at the Town Hall/Library, which have improved comfort and energy use.

The Selectmen continue to work on putting the town on firm financial footing by bringing the town into compliance with governmental accounting standards so that financial audits can pave the way for the town to participate in bonding major capital projects if and when the need arises. The Selectmen stand ready to assist the Planning Board in drafting a Capital Improvement Plan (CIP), which will enable the town to make use of its Capital Reserve Fund appropriations in concert with a long-range plan for capital projects.

Much of the past year has been spent studying improvements to the Transfer Station, resulting in a proposal to replace the trash compactor, adding a compactor for co-mingled recyclables to reduce disposal costs, improving safety and traffic flow with a re-designed traffic pattern, reducing electrical use with installation of a variable frequency drive and replacing the attendants' shed. Also, the town has instituted a small fee for disposal of tires and electrical equipment in an effort to reduce unreasonable high volumes of these items.

In 2013, the Selectmen continue to work on reducing costs through energy efficiency measures, laying the groundwork for replacement of the deteriorating salt storage shed and maintaining a stable tax rate while addressing important town needs.

We welcome your suggestions, and thank you for the opportunity to serve the town as your Selectmen.

EFFINGHAM ENERGY REPORT 2012

Wood Pellet Boiler

The town proceeded with the installation of the grant funded wood pellet boiler, replacing the 30 year old forced hot water oil furnace for the municipal offices. A building energy assessor was hired to confirm what had been estimated heat loss of the building utilizing thermal imaging and a blower door test. This helped in properly sizing the boiler.

Additional grant funds allowed the hiring of an energy consulting firm to review the proposed design of the new heating and hot water system, oversee the technical installation and commission the boiler upon completion of the installation. The project was completed in September 2012 passing all inspections.

Briefly, the new heating system includes a Froling automatic wood pellet boiler with a spray foam insulated 200 gallon thermal storage tank to keep hot water hot and ready for heat distribution at all times. The boiler is automatically loaded with fuel via pneumatic vacuum hose from the 12 ton silo just outside the door to the boiler room. The silo is filled pneumatically from a pellet delivery truck that looks much like an oil supply truck.

The new domestic hot water heater is a propane on-demand wall mounted boiler that will also act as what is called a peaking back up unit to the pellet boiler. Most boiler systems are designed to supply heat for the very coldest it usually gets in the region, say 20 degrees below zero. Our pellet boiler is the next size smaller so that it runs more efficiently in the shoulder seasons of spring and fall, with the hot water heater there to assist when needed to heat during the coldest days of winter. Indeed, the hot water heater is itself a boiler that can fully back up the wood pellet boiler should it ever be offline for servicing.

The only routine maintenance of the boiler is ash removal expected to be monthly. The boiler system will be inspected annually by our boiler contractor.

With less heat loss expected with the new heating system, extra grant funds were secured to provide insulation in the ceiling: to insulate the water pipes running between the suspended ceiling and the roof, and to facilitate access to the pipes, the old ceiling tiles (along with old batting insulation) were replaced with new US made insulated ceiling tiles.

The total grant funds utilized were \$56,517.

The **local economy supported** by the project included four contractors and their subcontractors, local heating and plumbing suppliers, a New Hampshire pellet boiler distributor, a Connecticut silo company that delivered and built the silo on site (staying overnight locally), and our New Hampshire wood products industry from which the town will source its fuel into the future. The choice of a 12 ton silo was strategic to enable full truck delivery, lowering the cost and making the town an attractive customer to any regional pellet supplier.

The year 2012 has been a time of big changes for the Effingham Police Department.

Chief Joseph Collins left the department to take over as Chief of Gilmanton Police Department. Chief Collins served as Chief of Police from September 2003 through August 2012.

Chief Collins was instrumental in modernizing the police department by moving to a newer facility, automating information management by obtaining the IMC program (Information Management Corporation). He also was the driving force behind the department's participation in Department of Highway Safety Grant programs such as Operation Safe Commute and Selected Speed Enforcement programs. Chief Collins also added a second full time patrol Sergeant to better serve the law enforcement needs of the community. He will be missed by the police department and residents alike.

Chief Collins was the arresting officer who apprehended a fugitive from the State of Nevada resulting in his being returned to Nevada to face felony criminal charges.

Report of Forest Fire Warden and State Forest Ranger

Your local Forest Fire Warden, Fire Department, and the State of New Hampshire Division of Forests & Lands, work collaboratively to reduce the risk and frequency of wildland fires in New Hampshire. To help us assist you, please contact your local Forest Fire Warden or Fire Department to determine if a permit is required before doing ANY outside burning. Under State law (RSA 227-L:17) a fire permit is required for all outside burning, unless the ground is completely covered with snow. The New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services also prohibits the open burning of household waste. Citizens are encouraged to contact the local fire department or DES at 603-271-1370 or www.des.state.nh.us for more information. Safe open burning requires diligence and responsibility. Help us to protect New Hampshire's forest resources. For more information please contact the Division of Forests & Lands at (603) 271-2214, or online at www.nhdfl.org.

Due to a record warm winter and little snow, our first fire occurred on February 4th with several more early fires to follow. Normally a large percentage of the warm windy days with low humidity occur when the ground is saturated from a long snow covered winter. By the time the surface fuels and ground dry out enough to burn, we only have a few weeks until "green up". This year however we had an extended period of these favorable spring fire conditions. Our largest fire in the state was 86 acres. The average size fire was .6 acres. Extensive summer rains kept total acreage burned to near normal levels

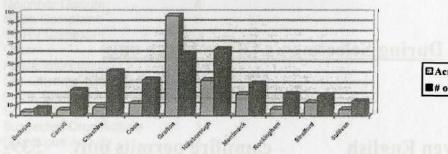
As has been the case over the last few years, state budget constraints have limited the staffing of our statewide system of 16 fire lookout towers to Class III or higher fire danger days. Despite the reduction in the number of days staffed, our fire lookouts are credited with keeping most fires small and saving several structures due to their quick and accurate spotting capabilities. The towers fire spotting was supplemented by the NH Civil Air Patrol when the fire danger was especially high. Several of the fires during the 2012 season threatened structures, a constant reminder that forest fires burn more than just trees. Please help Smokey Bear, your local fire department, and the state's Forest Rangers by being fire wise and fire safe!

Lifestar EMS, LLC. d/b/a Ossipee Valley EMS 2012 Town Report

2012 was another good year for Lifestar EMS, we added 5 wheelchair vans to our fleet that also get used as courtesy shuttles for individuals needing transport from local hospitals to their homes within our coverage area. This is on a case by case bases pending availability of a driver. To date we have not turned anyone away.

We still have 5 frequently used ambulances that serve our 911 contracted towns as well as anyone in the local area that requests us. We have several state of the art electronics on our ambulances such as the ability to transmit a 12 lead EKG to our destination hospital so they may prepare the appropriate clinical care and transport for our incoming patient. This process has saved several lives in the last few years.

We have 3 stations located in Ossippee to reduce our response times, that mixed with our minimal on scene times allow us to get our patients too definitive care sooner. This greatly reduces long term disabilities as well as saves lives.

We offer classes for First Aid, CPR and AED as well as courses for anyone looking to become an EMT or a higher level provider.

The Town of Effingham utilized our services for 253 calls for service in 2012.

141 required transport and of the 141 transports 128 received Advanced Level Care. We staff at least 1 Paramedic 24 hours a day if not 2-3 paramedics on most days.

Resident transports last year were 117 of the 141 transports.

Last year we had 112 calls for service that did not require patient transport.

Dog Officer's Report 2012

Dog bites were reported on two occasions this past year with one dog being quarantined at the owner's expense at Lakes Region Humane Society. Both animals were able to escape from the confines of their property and bite passers by. It is important to ensure that your dog remains in your control or confined on your property at all times.

Unlicensed dogs have more than doubled in number this past year. Dog owners are reminded that all dogs must be licensed by April 30, 2013 and that proof of vaccination for Rabies is required at the time of licensing. Bring a copy of the Rabies Vaccination when you register your dog. Please make a concerted effort to have your pet properly licensed and vaccinated.

Clinics for vaccination and several spay and neuter programs are offered in the community throughout the year making these requirements more affordable.

Please ensure that all dogs left out doors have shelter, food, and fresh water available to them.

Please refrain from leaving your canine companion in your vehicle on hot days. The interior temperature of your vehicle can be overwhelming for a canine even with the windows left slightly open.

Library Director's 2012 Report

2012 was a very good year for the Effingham Public Library. Library upgrades and a huge increase in circulations kept everyone busy this year.

Patron visits, which had decreased 4% last year over the previous year, increased this year by 6%. Patrons seem to be staying longer, and dramatic increases in circulation indicate they are using their library more than ever. Children's and Young Adult checkouts decreased by 13% over last year, but that was offset by increases in the Adult collection by 40%, Audio Books by 95%, Downloadable Books by 19%, and Movies by 49%. Overall circulations increased by 29% over 2011. Library computer use and wireless also increased.

The 2012 Summer Reading Program theme was "Dream Big- READ!" Fifteen children participated and read 755 books. They logged 17,134 minutes, or 285.5 hours of reading time. While the number of participants was down slightly over the previous year, it was a successful and fun program. Special events included a visit from the Boston Museum of Science doing a program on rockets, and a presentation from Master Mime Robert Rivest, where he had the children participate in his performance.

This year, we upgraded some of our outdated technology, replacing a staff computer, and purchasing four laptop computers for patrons to use. The laptops allow greater flexibility for patrons to use them wherever they wish within the Library building, using our wireless connection to the internet.

The electrical system in the Library was upgraded- an improvement that was greatly needed. With more outlets in the Meeting Room, the office and behind the circulation desk, we have been able to get rid of hazardous extension cords and relocate equipment and devices to where they can be used most efficiently. The lighting in the Meeting Room was also upgraded, allowing more flexibility and comfort for different programs and activities.

The Meeting Room walls were repaired and the entire room was repainted. In the fall, the Children's Room, Computer Room, office and bathrooms were repainted. New carpeting was installed in the Computer, Children's and Meeting Rooms. The new paint has made everything look brighter and fresher, and the carpeting makes the entire building warmer and quieter. Many thanks to volunteers Micheal Gruel, Donna Gruel, Mike Cauble, Bill Taylor, Jan Smith, Henry Spencer, Erik Jones, Zachary Lavoie, Michelle Taylor and A.J. Lavoie; trustees Carol Pfister, Cheryle Feirick, Jack Williams, Maureen Spencer and Celine Bergeron; and staff-members John Mingori and Gary Mason for all the work before, during and after each phase of our upgrades. These projects could not have been accomplished as quickly, efficiently and economically without their efforts.

The Friends of the Effingham Library purchased and donated 50 stacking chairs and dollies for storing them. The Friends also purchased passes to the Remick Farm and Country Doctor Museum in Tamworth, the Wright Museum in Wolfeboro, and a summer pass to the Children's Museum of New Hampshire in Dover. The Effingham Historical Society purchased and donated a mirrored corner cabinet to display Historical Society artifacts on a rotating basis, as well as two passes to the New Hampshire Historical Society Museum and Library.

Library staff and volunteers continue to provide a wide range of programs for all ages and interests, including story times, Krafty Kids workshops and special holiday events for children; Writer's Night, the Knit and Crochet Group, book discussions, film series and workshops for adults; and movie or games nights for teens. Highlights this past year included *The National Parks* film series and a presentation by Dave and Gail Overberg on seeing the National Parks on \$50.00 per day, books to movies film series, *Hiking the White Mountains in Winter* with Jeb Bradley, and a visit from Santa.

Our amazing volunteers provided 860 hours of service in 2012- just over 35 weeks of time! Thank you to regular volunteers Michael Davidson, Kathy Lambert, Carol Pfister, Ginny Dumas, Donna Gruel, Johanna Vienneau, Erik Jones, Annette Keller, Michelle Taylor, and A.J. Lavoie, for all you do each week! And thank you to all the other volunteers, who show up for special projects when needed. Their dedication and contributions are invaluable.

Finally, a thank you to the residents of Effingham for your continued support of YOUR library and of your library staff. Each and every one of you is responsible for the continued success of the library and its programs.

2012 Report from the Effingham Conservation Commission

The Effingham Conservation Commission (ECC) continued working on the Natural Resources chapter for the Master Plan. With the help of UNH extension and Susan Yakutis, ECC has completed their chapter and awaits acceptance from the Planning Board.

The Earth Day poster contest theme this year for Effingham Elementary School was "Be a Friend to the Earth". Winners were selected and prizes were presented to the winners in each grade.

The annual spring roadside cleanup was held on April 28th. There were 94 bags of trash picked up. After the cleanup, a cook out was held for those who participated. The cleanup for the fall was canceled due to weather and a lack of participation. Later it was suggested ECC provide grabbers, bags, and gloves at the Library for sign out which are now available to all residents. This way people can use them to clean up the roads around their residences. ECC found this to be a good idea and has done so.

ECC donated \$1,000.00 to The Province Lake Association for their Lake Host Program to help stop the spread of invasive plants in Province Lake. There will be a warrant at the Town Meeting to vote on future expenditures for this program.

Jack Williams designed and constructed a roadside sign for the Larry Leavitt Preserve (LLP). It is now in place and awaiting the common yellow throat bird to be painted by Emelyn. Also, a September 18 cleanup of the LLP was conducted, and trails were cleaned and checked access for people with disabilities. Brush was cut, and the area was neatened up. The commission discussed placing a picnic table at the preserve so people will have a place to sit and have a small picnic while visiting.

Also discussed was purchasing a new picnic table for the Green Mountain Fire Tower on top of the mountain and prices have been obtained for this project. This is something that will happen in 2013.

The ECC continues to find possible solutions to Grace Barter's shoreline erosion on Province Lake.

ECC has been offered Lots 159/Map 413 and Lot 15/Map 106 by the Town for conservation. This will be voted on at the Town meeting by warrant.

Variable milfoil cleanup took place at the Route 153 boat ramp and Ossipee Lake in October by New England Milfoil. 1120 gallons of milfoil were collected. Bill Klotz was kind enough to take it for compost. The milfoil clean up will continue in 2013.

ECC is pleased to have Virginia Wrabel has our newest member in 2012.

Effingham Agricultural Commission Annual Report for 2012

Mission Statement: The Purpose of the Effingham Agricultural Commission is to protect agricultural lands, preserve the rural character, provide a voice for farmers and encourage agricultural based business and activities, as well as promote stewardship and best practices for property and natural resources.

2012 has been a fairly quiet year for the Agricultural Commission. Early efforts focused on facilitating the formation of a steering committee for an Effingham farmer's market. Many thanks to Jim Morris, Celine Bergeron, Brenda Perry and Barbara Thompson with consulting assistance from AnnMarie Sargent for stepping up to take charge of this endeavor. Although not an official function of the Agricultural Commission, we would like to report, with input from the farmer's market steering committee, that the market was a great success. It was held on the Boyle's Family Market property and had twelve vendors present on opening day.

As the Commission is strictly an advisory board, one of our main functions is to educate the public about the status of agriculture in the Town, County and State. Whenever possible, we have a display that is put out to encourage residents to give input on various subjects, from asking for their interpretations of rural character to input on legislative issues pertinent to agriculture. To assist us in these endeavors the Commission has joined both the NH Farm Bureau and Northeast Organic Farming Association (NOFA). The NH Farm Bureau has a newsletter which presents all legislation being considered in the State Congress and gives us the opportunity to recognize quickly those issues crucial to farming/ agriculture. NOFA is a large organization devoted to providing workshops and seminars on a wide range of subjects from grants for farmers to almost any subject on horticulture. We would like to encourage anyone who is involved in agriculture in any form to feel free to contact the Commission for help in researching, clarifying or assisting in any of these areas.

The Commission currently has four members and two alternates. We would welcome anyone who would like to participate in looking out for the interests of the agricultural community. Our regular meeting is the fourth Wednesday of the month starting at 7:00 pm at the Town Offices on School Street and the public is always welcome.
